Background

The Council has three? telephone kiosks -purchases circa 2016

- a. The Street, opposite the Sun Inn - home of the Little Lydiard Library
- b. Greenhill – currently not used for anything
- c. Stone Lane, Common Platt - ?

Request Received

A resident has contacted the Council regarding the telephone box on Greenhill. It is looking pretty bad, the resident said that he will paint it if the Council is willing to buy the paint.

It also needs a good clean, and he said that he would get some local volunteers to help do that.

Paint Details

A single pack solvent-based coating designed for use as a refinishing paint for K2, K6 and K8 telephone kiosks and boxes. Based on a urethane modified resin system which provides a strong paint film with good chemical resistance and a mirror-like original red gloss. Selection of high quality pigments further enhances the properties by providing improved weathering resistance and light fastness of the coating.

Application can be by Roller, Paintbrush or Spray - Drying Time 90 mins – Overcoating time 24 hrs - the finish is gloss.

Tin size to paint the kiosk would be 5 litres, at the cost £ 49.99 +£9.99 delivery = £59.98

Recommendation

Should Members be minded to accept the offer to clean and paint the telephone kiosk then funding is required.

Funding

There is no budget line for the maintenance of the Telephone Kiosks therefore Members are requested to allocate an amount of up to £100 from General Reserves to cover the cost, the paint and paint brushes and materials to rub down the kiosk.

Materials to be purchased by the Council.

Insurance

The Council does have insurance cover for volunteers whilst undertaking business activities and Public Liability insurance.
